Description of the course	English for Business Studies is an upper-intermediate to advanced level reading, listening, speaking and writing course for students who need to understand and express the key concepts of business and economics in English. It covers the most important areas of finance and economics, divided into 14 units, from Unit 15 to Unit 28.			
Objectives of the course:	 The course aims to: present the students with the language and concepts of business and economic found in books, journals, newspapers and magazines, and on websites; develop their comprehension of business and economics texts; develop their listening skills in the fields of business and economics; provide them with opportunities to express business concepts both verbally and in writing, by reformulating them in their own words while summarizing, analysing, criticizing and discussing ideas. 			
Expected results of learning:	This course should enable the students to build vocabulary through reading, listening and speaking, and to improve their confidence and fluency in expressing themselves in speaking and writing about the diverse topics related to business and economics.
