Description of the subject	<p>Knowledge of law and legal regulation of business. The program is explained through units dealing with the basic categories of law and the state, object and subjects of business law, valid and unreasonable legal works, contractual relations - contracts, the right of commercial companies, types of companies and enterprises banking, banking, industrial property and securities.</p>
Objectives of the course:	<p>The course aims to prepare students for business environment and to skill them on how to register the business and how to deal with relations. In particular, the underlying purpose relates to the recognition of the obligations that are subject to the right of establishment of all legal business relations. Simply, knowing and respecting the aspect of the law in business relations.</p>
Expected learning outcomes:	<p>At the end, students will be able to understand:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Role and function of the state and the right in general in the socio-economic life and concretely in the field of business regulation; - Types, power and effect of social norms related to the legal system; - Combination and arrangement of the economic law system regarding the conducting of business entities and implementation of legal norms in practice; - Sources of liabilities with particular emphasis on the structure and types of business

Teaching methodology: Lectures, seminars, class discussion, presentation and discussions of seminars.

Methods of assessment: The question will be more in writing. Their formulation will be made from the teaching material taught in the hall and their form will be combined (optional and short questions in the form of essays).

Assessment method:

- Development and introduction of seminar paper, 10% of final grade;
- Two tests represent 90% of the final grade.
- The first test includes 45% of the teaching material;
- The second test includes 45% of the final grade.

Therefore, if you pass two tests, and if you are regular and active in the lectures, and if you are conducting the seminar, you do not need to undergo the final test.

	<p>If the student fails to undergo one of the tests then he/she will be subject to the final exam. Also, students who have participated in both tests and who have not accumulated 51% of the points and students who are not satisfied with the result achieved during the semester should undergo the final exam.</p> <p>Final test: To pass the test, students must reach at least 51% of the predicted points.</p>

Eleventh Week:	Public enterprise; Social enterprise; Individual enterprise; cooperatives
Twelfth Week:	Interaction and reorganization of business associations and termination of business associations and individual enterprises, Liquidation, failure and reorganization
Thirteenth Week:	Industrial property, author copyright and other similar rights
Fourteenth Week:	Basic knowledge of securities rules; Check - meaning and characteristics; bills of exchange; credit cards – types and characteristics; Legitimate letters and signs
Fifteen week:	2nd test
