| Assessment methods: | The exam will be in writing. Questions formulated from classroom teaching material and are form of short essay questions. Evaluation: Active class participation, 10% of final exam. Development and presentation of seminar paper, 10% of final exam. Two tests representing 80% of the final exam. The first test involves about 50% of the teaching material, and the rest in the second test. Each of the tests, if passed, has a value of 40% of the final notes. Therefore, if you pass two tests, and if you are regular and active in the lesson, and if you are conducting the seminar, you do not need to undergo the final test. If students do not pass one of the foreseen tests, you can only repeat once. If you do not pass the exam in, you will obligated to take the final test-test.
